The winners of this year's awards include: *Becoming Mrs. Lewis* by Patti Callahan (Fiction), *The Story of Alabama in Fourteen Foods* by Emily Blejwas (Nonfiction), *Turtles All the Way Down* by John Green (Young Adult Fiction), *Meet Miss Fancy* by Irene Latham (Juvenile), and *The Magic City Gospel* by Ashley Jones (Poetry Award). The Association also honors a Lifetime Achievement Award to Charles Ghigna for his prolific career writing and encouraging reading in children.

About Alabama Story

Alabama Shakespeare Festival presents Alabama Story by Kenneth Jones on the Octagon Stage March 5 through March 22, 2020. Directed by ASF Artistic Director Rick Dildine, this production brings home a play that was inspired by true events from 1959 Montgomery and was created at Alabama Shakespeare Festival. Rich with all the complexities of human nature, this tale from Alabama history remains stunningly relevant to today's world.

At the center of the story is State Librarian Emily Wheelock Reed – a champion of intellectual freedom – and her stand against a



segregationist state senator seeking to ban a gentle children's book, in which a black rabbit marries a white rabbit. A parallel story unfolds between two young adults – an African-American man and a white woman – reunited after being torn apart as children.

In 2013, Jones spent time in residence at Alabama Shakespeare Festival workshopping the script as part of the Southern Writers Festival. Since then, Alabama Story has resonated across the nation as a reminder of the importance of the free flow of information and why protecting this constitutional right is healthy for citizens and society.

Submissions must:

- **1.** Be from a new professional librarian with no more than five years of experience.
- 2. Address an idea or perspective on current library issues.
- **3.** Have a broad southeastern scope and/or address topics identified as timely or important by SELA sections, round tables, or committees.
- **4.** Submitted in electronic format as an attachment to an email, preferably in MS Word or a compatible format.
- 5. Provide complete and accurate bibliographic citations.

Although longer or shorter works may be considered, 2,000- to 5,000-word manuscripts are most suitable. Authors agree to assign copyright of manuscripts to The Southeastern Library Association, subject to certain limited licenses granted back to the author. The winner will be invited to present their paper at an upcoming SELA conference. The monetary award for New Voices is sponsored by EBSCO.
