From planning to performing quality control, each stage of metadata record production will be discussed. Topics include: standards and principles, developing local policies and procedures, metadata record modeling, producing records and linking, testing, and statistics.

PREREQUISITE: Participants should be familiar with the following standards: Anglo-American Cataloging Rules (AACR2), Machine Readable Cataloging (MARC), and Dublin Core Metadata Initiative (unqualified DC).
